This includes a full examination, photos, and a comprehensive report on the firearm, its condition, history, and value or potential value.

How long does it take?

Because we serve clients all over the U.S., the demand for our restoration services is high. Evaluations can take 3-6 months and 12-18 months for restoration depending on the complexity of the work needed.

Is there a cost?

Due to the technical and in depth nature of the evaluation there is a \$350.00 (plus tax) non-refundable fee. Should you decide to move forward with any of the proposed work, 50% of that fee will be credited towards your total cost.

What do I do now!

- Depending on your location, the gun can be dropped off at our
 office or shipped directly to our gunsmith. This is when the evaluation fee is collected.
- Wait for your evaluation report and then decide if you would like to move forward with restoration. Should you move forward we will credit half of the evaluation fee to your total and collect a 50% deposit.
- When the work has been completed we will reach out to you and arrange a time for pick up or shipment from our gunsmith back to you. The remainder of the balance will then be collected.
